

Grooming Tips:

The Vac-Groom generally requires about a week of working to get use to using it, to become comfortable with the new addition to your clippers. But once you get accustomed, you won't be without it.

Tip #1:

Because the Vac-Groom lifts the hair before it cuts, it cuts shorter than without the Vac-Groom. (Example: a #5 blade will be approximately equal to a #7 blade)

Tip #2:

We recommend you begin marking your client card with and without the Vac-Groom. (Example: #5 blade - Kennel, or #5 blade - K-W/Vac)

Tip #3:

When grooming dogs with loose hair or excess skin, care should be taken to stretch the skin to get a smooth cut. Vac-Groom works well with cats also, although extreme caution should be used because of the difference of the skin.

Tip #4:

Caution should be taken when grooming long coated dogs that have hair you do not wish to cut, because it may accidentally be sucked up to the clipper.

Tip #5:

Some coat textures, when groomed using a clipper vacuuming system will leave lines or tracks. This problem can be remedied by using a longer blade and cutting against the grain.

Tip #6:

Don't be afraid to experiment with the Vac-Groom. For instance, using your standard clipper comb attachments with Vac-Groom will allow you to achieve a much longer cut and still be smooth, thus saving scissoring time.
